The need for nurse educators is of critical concern to the health care field. The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics projects 20 percent national job growth and 32 percent in Georgia for nurse educators from 2018-2029.

### ANNUAL SALARY AVERAGES

Nurse educator salaries vary according to state, job site, specialty, role, degree and experience. Salary ranges in Georgia tend to be lower than the national averages.

Priority application deadline: January 15th  
 Final application deadline: April 28th  
 New students begin courses each August.

To ensure you are considered for the next entry point, submit your application, application fee and required documentation by the priority deadline. **APPLICATION CRITERIA**

- Admission decisions for acceptance are based on overall evaluation of these components:
- Baccalaureate degree in nursing from a nationally accredited institution with a satisfactory GPA of at least 3.0
  - Current unencumbered RN licensure in the state of Georgia (submit copy)
  - A formal statement of personal goals for the program
  - Undergraduate research course
  - Two professional letters of reference
